Official Programme Affiliation

This Intensive Learning Opportunity is implemented within the framework of the ENHANCE+ European University of Technology Alliance and supported by the Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange (NAWA).

Participation Conditions and Financial Support

Participation in the learning opportunity is **free of charge for all admitted participants**.

Within the framework of ENHANCE+ and NAWA support mechanisms, qualified participants outside WUT are entitled to receive a lump-sum grant intended to partially cover travel and subsistence (accommodation and living) costs related to the on-site component of the program. The amount and conditions of the lump sum will be communicated to selected participants in accordance with applicable ENHANCE+ and NAWA regulations. Admission and Number of Places

A Project Participant may be a person with English language proficiency at level B2 or higher and having (subject to point 4) one of the following statuses:

a) a student of the final two semesters of first-cycle studies, second-cycle studies, or the final two semesters of long-cycle Master's studies, including:

- WUT student,
- a student of higher education or research institution (European or non-European),

b) a doctoral student, including:

- a WUT doctoral student,
- a doctoral student of a higher education or research institution (European or non-European),,

c) an academic teacher holding at least a doctoral degree, employed in a research, research-and-teaching or equivalent position at a foreign institution, including:

- an academic teacher employed at WUT,
- an academic teacher employed at a higher education or research institution (European or non-European).

Admission is competitive.

The number of available places is limited to 15 international participants per each of two planned editions.

16 international students (8 students per each of two planned Editions)

14 international doctoral students/staff/early stage researchers (7 persons per each of two planned Editions)

10 WUT Students/PhD students/staff (5 persons per each of two planned Editions)

! Selected candidates (for Edition I) will be informed about their acceptance till 25 March 2026 via e-mail, and will be asked to register at NAWA portal as Participants of the project till 30 March 2026 (registration is obligatory for selected Candidates).

! Selected candidates (for Edition II) will be informed about their acceptance till 20 April 2026 via e-mail, and will be asked to register at NAWA portal as Participants of the project till 30 April 2026 (registration is obligatory for selected Candidates).

To apply for participation in the Project, an applicant must complete and submit the Application Form within the call deadline, including:

- filling out all mandatory fields in the Application Form, including a description of the candidate's motivation to participate in the Course, research interests, and the most significant scientific achievements/activities to date (e.g., membership in a scientific club, conference presentations, publications);
- accepting all consents included in the Application Form by selecting the "I consent" option
- preparing, signing, and attaching a scanned Declaration of Familiarization with and Acceptance of the Provisions of These Regulations (according to the template provided in Appendix 2);

- d) attaching scans of the following documents (and, if selected for participation, presenting originals to the Organizer on the first day of the Course):
- **a certificate confirming English language proficiency at level B2 or higher (may be issued by institution of affiliation);**
 - **a certificate issued by institution of affiliation confirming the status of a student of the final two semesters of first-cycle studies or second-cycle studies, or final two semesters of long-cycle Master's studies, a doctoral student, or an employed academic teacher, issued no earlier than one month before submitting the application;**
 - **a doctoral diploma – applies to academic teachers;**
 - **a statement of disability – applies to persons facing particular barriers and limitations affecting equal access to resources and social benefits.**
