§1 General Provisions

1. The project entitled “ENHANCED Learning Campus (ELC) – rozwój międzynarodowej oferty Politechniki Warszawskiej” (hereinafter: the Project) is implemented under the programme “SPINAKER – Intensive International Education Programmes 2024” by the Warsaw University of Technology, PI Politechniki 1, 00-661 Warsaw, NIP 525 000 58 34. Regon: 000001554 (hereinafter: WUT or the Organizer) under an agreement with the Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange (NAWA), Contract No. BPI/SPI/2024/1/00050/U/00001, financed from the European Funds for Social Development 2021-2027 (EFSD) under the NAWA project “Support for the creation and implementation of international education programmes”, Project No. FERS.01.05-IP.08-0436/23.

2. As part of the Project, the Organizer will develop and conduct a pilot edition of an intensive international education programme in English in the form of a 60-hour course entitled CHARACTERIZATION OF MODERN MATERIALS FOR ENERGY STORAGE addressed to persons interested in development and characterization of materials for energy storage and conversion area (hereinafter: the Course).

3. The Course will be delivered in blended form (online lectures and onsite laboratories & tutorials) in Warsaw at Faculty of Chemistry WUT, Noakowskiego St.3 , 00-664 Warsaw, Poland. Two editions are planned:

4. The Course will provide interdisciplinary education with want hands-on experience with state-of-the-art material characterization techniques used in modern energy technologies. The program combines strong theoretical foundations with practical laboratory experience. Participants will work with advanced analytical methods widely used in research and industry, developing skills that directly support their future career.

5. The purpose of these Regulations is to define the rules for participant recruitment and conditions of participation in the Project, including in particular the rules for submitting applications to the Course, the evaluation of applications (including formal and substantive criteria), participant selection, available forms of financial support for international participants, as well as the principles for verifying learning outcomes.

§2 Project Participants

1. A Project Participant may be a person with English language proficiency at level B2 or higher and having (subject to point 4) one of the following statuses:

a) a student of the final two semesters of first-cycle studies, second-cycle studies, or the final semesters of long-cycle Master's studies, including:

- WUT student,
- a student of higher education or research institution (European or non-European),

b) a doctoral student, including:

- a WUT doctoral student,
- a doctoral student of a higher education or research institution (European or non-European),,

c) an academic teacher holding at least a doctoral degree, employed in a research, research-and-teaching or equivalent position at a foreign institution, including:

- an academic teacher employed at WUT,
- an academic teacher employed at a higher education or research institution (European or non-European).

a) European higher education and research institutions refer to institutions located in the following countries: Albania, Andorra, Austria, Belgium, Belarus, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Spain, the Netherlands, Ireland, Iceland, Kosovo, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Latvia, North Macedonia, Malta, Moldova, Monaco, Germany, Norway, Portugal, Romania, San Marino, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Switzerland, Sweden, Türkiye, Ukraine, Vatican City, Hungary, the United Kingdom, Italy.

b) non-European higher education and research institutions refer to institutions located in the following countries: Afghanistan, Algeria, Saudi Arabia, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Bahrain, Benin, Bhutan, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Chad, Cape Verde, Central African Republic, China, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Djibouti, Egypt, Eritrea, Gabon, Gambia, Georgia, Ghana, Guinea, Guinea-Bissau, Equatorial Guinea, Iraq, Iran, Iceland, India, Israel, Ivory Coast, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Korea, Kuwait, Lebanon, Libya, Morocco, Kenya, Kyrgyzstan, Liberia, Mali, Mauritania, Mexico, Mongolia, Nepal, Niger, Nigeria, Oman, Pakistan, Palestine, Qatar, Rwanda, São Tomé and Príncipe, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sudan, South Sudan, Syria, Tajikistan, Togo, Turkmenistan, Uganda, Uzbekistan, United Arab Emirates, Yemen.

A maximum of 40 persons will be admitted to participate in the Course under the Project, selected according to the structure of participants specified above and according to the rules and procedures set out in these Regulations. This includes 30 persons from abroad and 10 persons from the Warsaw University of Technology

Due to the termination of cooperation between the Government of the Republic of Poland and the Government of the Russian Federation under the Agreement on Cooperation in the Field of Culture, Science and Education, concluded in Warsaw on 25 August 1993, as a result of the Russian Federation's aggression against Ukraine, natural persons who are citizens of the Russian Federation are excluded from participation in the Project.

§3 Project Participants Recruitment Rules

1. The announcement of the call for applications to participate in the Project, including submission deadlines, will be published on the Project Website.
2. Recruitment of Project Participants will be conducted electronically through an Application Form available on the Project Website (the Application Form template constitutes Appendix 1).
3. Recruitment will be conducted in accordance with the principles of impartiality, transparency, openness, equal rights, equal opportunities, and non-discrimination.
4. Persons requiring special support during the recruitment process due to disability are requested to notify the Project Office in order to ensure appropriate assistance.
5. To apply for participation in the Project, an applicant must complete and submit the Application Form within the call deadline, including:
 - a) filling out all mandatory fields in the Application Form, including a description of the candidate's motivation to participate in the Course, research interests, and the most significant scientific achievements/activities to date (e.g., membership in a scientific club, conference presentations, publications);
 - b) accepting all consents included in the Application Form by selecting the "I consent" option
 - c) preparing, signing, and attaching a scanned Declaration of Familiarization with and Acceptance of the Provisions of These Regulations (according to the template provided in Appendix 2);
 - d) attaching scans of the following documents (and, if selected for participation, presenting originals to the Organizer on the first day of the Course):
 - **a certificate confirming English language proficiency at level B2 or higher (may be issued by institution of affiliation);**
 - **a certificate issued by institution of affiliation confirming the status of a student of the final two semesters of first-cycle studies or second-cycle studies, or final semesters of long-cycle Master's studies, a doctoral student, or an employed academic teacher, issued no earlier than one month before submitting the application;**
 - **a doctoral diploma – applies to academic teachers;**
 - **a statement of disability – applies to persons facing particular barriers and limitations affecting equal access to resources and social benefits.**
6. The selection of Project Participants will be conducted by the Recruitment Committee, comprising the Project Team (hereinafter: the Committee), chaired by the Project Manager (hereinafter: the Chairperson of the Committee), based on formal and substantive assessment of the applications referred to in point 5, taking into account the available places referred to in point 13.
7. The formal assessment of applications will include:
 - a) evaluation of completeness of submitted documents and acceptance of required consents;
 - b) evaluation of whether the candidate meets all formal requirements set out in these Regulations.

A negative formal assessment will result in rejection of the application.
8. As part of the substantive assessment, based on the application received, each candidate will receive points for the description of motivation for participation in the Course, the alignment of research interests with the Course programme, and scientific achievements/activities to date. The substantive assessment will

consist of the sum of points awarded by each of the 4 Committee members on a scale of 1–10 points (a candidate may receive a maximum of 40 points, subject to point 9). The minimum threshold is 15 points. Candidates scoring below 15 points will not qualify for the Course.

9. The highest number of points will be awarded to applications that comprehensively, coherently, and substantively:

- Present a clearly formulated and logically justified motivation for participation in the Course;
- Demonstrate a high degree of alignment between the candidate's research interests and the Course topics and scope;
- Present scientific achievements or activities appropriate to the candidate's career stage and relevant to the Course topics;
- A candidate who submits a statement of disability confirming that they belong to a group facing particular barriers and limitations affecting equal access to resources and social goods will receive additional 5 points.
- Based on the substantive assessment results, the Committee will prepare ranking lists of applications divided into the 3 participant groups referred to in §2 point 1.
- In the case of applications with identical scores, priority will be given to candidates of the underrepresented gender within a given participant group. If candidates of the same gender receive the same score, the Chairperson of the Committee will decide the ranking order.
- The results of the Committee's work will be presented in a protocol, including ranking lists for each participant group, a list of applications that did not meet the minimum score threshold, and a list of applications rejected for formal reasons.

10. Candidates will be admitted to the Project in order of ranking lists, starting from the highest score, until available places within each participant group are filled, specifically:

16 international students (8 students per each of two planned Editions)

14 international doctoral students/staff/early stage researchers (7 persons per each of two planned Editions)

10 WUT Students/PhD students/staff (5 persons per each of two planned Editions)

as well as taking into account limits for international participants from specific country groups listed in the NAWA regulations.

11. The Organizer reserves the right to adjust the declared place limits depending on interest and assessment results.

12. Candidates will be notified of recruitment results electronically. Final admission to the Project depends on fulfilling the obligations listed in §4.

13. If a candidate fails to meet the obligations arising from §4 or withdraws from the Project at the recruitment stage, the next candidate from the relevant ranking list will be admitted to the Project.

14. If an insufficient number of project participants are recruited, additional recruitment will be arranged. The Organizer will determine and announce the rules for supplementary recruitment, including its scope, form and dates.

§4 Conditions of participation in the Project

1. A Candidate qualified for participation in the Project is in particular obliged to:
2. Register an account in the NAWA ICT system,
3. Complete the electronic project participant form in the NAWA ICT system and accept all required consents, including information clauses, immediately after receiving the appropriate link from the Organizer, and provide the Organizer with confirmation of submitting the form in the NAWA system by e-mail, as well as the .pdf file generated from the NAWA system,
4. Complete, sign, and send a scanned copy of the Declaration of Participation in the Project (hereinafter: Declaration) to the Project Office, a template of which can be found in Appendix 3, and the GDPR Consent Form in Appendix 6 within 7 days of receiving information about qualifying for participation in the Project, referred to in §3 point 12;
5. Provide the original documents listed in §3 point 5. no later than on the first day of the Course,
6. Promptly provide the Organizer with any additional documents and statements related to participation in the Project,
7. Take part in the evaluation of Project results conducted by NAWA within 4 weeks after completing participation in the Course, in questionnaires and evaluation studies conducted for the purposes of the Project by NAWA and the Organizer (see: §7).
8. Failure to fulfil any of the obligations specified in the above point within the time limit specified in point 1 will result in the candidate being removed from the list of Project Participants.
9. Each Project Participant is required to hold health insurance, civil liability insurance, and accident insurance valid in Poland for the duration of the course.
10. A Project Participant who has signed the Declaration may withdraw from participation in the Project only for important reasons, including in particular health reasons or other reasons beyond their control (including events of force majeure), provided that such reasons were not known to the Participant at the time of commencing participation in the Project. In the event of withdrawal or the occurrence of force majeure preventing participation in the Course, the Participant should immediately notify the Project Manager of this fact, no later than the day following the occurrence of the reason for withdrawal. If, due to health condition or other objective obstacle, the Participant is unable to inform about the reason for withdrawal within the required deadline, this obligation should be fulfilled by the Participant immediately after the obstacle ceases. Notifications should be made in writing or via email to: [anna.maziopa@pw.edu.pl]. Failure to report within the deadline may result in the withdrawal being deemed unjustified. The Project Manager may request a document confirming the occurrence of a valid reason for withdrawal.
11. In the event of withdrawal from participation in the Project, the Project Participant is obliged to submit a signed written statement indicating the reason for withdrawal, which must be delivered immediately by e-mail to the Project Manager. They are also obliged to return the entire amount of funding received for participation in the Project, referred to in §5 to the WUT account, no later than within 7 days from the date of withdrawal from participation in the Project.
12. Project Participants who require special support in taking part in the Course due to disability or other barriers or limitations are requested to report this fact to the Project Office in order to ensure

appropriate assistance, e.g., psychological support, indication of accommodation adapted to the needs of persons with disabilities, or provision of appropriate equipment or additional transport during the Course.

§5 Rules for financing Project Participants

1. Participation in the Project is free of charge.
2. Project Participants from WUT are not entitled to any funding related to participation in the Project.
3. Foreign Project Participants are entitled to funding for the costs of participation in the Project:
 - **International students:**
 - a one-time scholarship of PLN 525 per person (reduced by any social security contributions required under Polish law);
 - a lump sum for travel allowance according to the rates specified in Table 2;
 - a lump sum for living and accommodation costs of PLN 2,100 per person.
 - **International doctoral students and researchers:**
 - a one-time scholarship of PLN 875 per person (reduced by any social security contributions required under Polish law);
 - a lump sum for travel allowance according to the rates specified in Table 2;
 - a lump sum for living and accommodation costs of PLN 2,100 per person.

The lump sum for travel allowance will be paid after the Project Participant has fulfilled the obligations arising from §4

The lump sum for living and accommodation costs and the scholarship will be paid to Project Participants after they have fulfilled the obligations specified in §4, immediately after the start of the Course, but no later than within the first 5 days of their stay in Warsaw.

The above-mentioned funding will be transferred to the account indicated by the Project Participant in the Declaration, by bank transfer in PLN.

The Organizer does not provide accommodation, meals, or insurance for the duration of the Course—the Project Participant is obliged to cover these expenses on their own based on the funding mentioned above.

Regardless of circumstances, any Project Participant who does not appear on the first day of the Course, for a specific edition, at the place indicated in the Course program published on the Project Website, will lose their status as Project Participant and the financial resources mentioned above, and will be required to immediately return all funding received for participation in the Course to the account of WUT, no later than 24th April 2026 (Edition I Participant) and 3th July 2026 (Edition II Participant).

§6 Rights and obligations of the Organizer

The Organizer has the right to:

- process the personal data of the Project Participants in accordance with the applicable law,
- in justified cases, change the date or the daily schedule of the Course,
- request of submission of additional documents and statements by Participants related to their participation in the Project, if they become necessary for its implementation,
- make organizational, program or technical changes in the implementation of the Course if they are necessary to ensure the proper implementation of the Project, or if they result from legal regulations, decisions of supervisory institutions, or co-financing conditions.

If the Project Participant grossly fails to fulfil the obligations set out in these Regulations, or engages in reprehensible behavior that prevents their participation in the Course, including unjustified absence, actions hindering the implementation of the Project, behavior contrary to the principles of social coexistence or safety regulations, or violations of other procedures in force at the Organizer, the Organizer shall have the right to exclude the Project Participant from the Project and to demand repayment of the full amount of funding received. By accepting these Regulations, the Participant agrees to such repayment.

§7 Education Program

The detailed Education Program that will be implemented within the framework of the Course is available on the Project website (<https://www.ch.pw.edu.pl/ch/Studenci/Programy-Miedzynarodowe/Spinaker>) (hereinafter: the Education Program).

The Education Program will be delivered in the form of a 60-hour course and corresponds to 3 ECTS credits.

The Education Program will comply with the minimum standards of the Organizer, and changes to the program may occur in response to modifications in the academic offer and study plans presented by the Organizer. The course syllabus remains in force unless new legal measures or decisions at the university level are implemented. In the event of such legal changes, the syllabus will be adjusted in accordance with the amended legal framework. The syllabus and its scope may also be modified due to the natural development and evolution of the relevant field of knowledge.

Qualifications acquired as a result of participation in the Course:

Knowledge

- Has solid understanding of the fundamental principles behind rheology, FTIR and Raman spectroscopy, as well as electrochemical impedance spectroscopy (EIS), with a particular focus on how these methods are applied to materials for energy generation and storage.
- Understands of the relationships between structure and properties in modern materials used in energy-storage systems.
- Can recognize which analytical techniques are best suited for characterizing different classes of materials and their functional behavior.
- Understands how measurement protocols are designed and how experimental data are processed, validated and interpreted in the context of complex material characterization.

Skills

- Is able to carry out rheological, spectroscopic (FTIR/Raman) and EIS measurements in accordance with established laboratory procedures.
- Interprets experimental data and formulates well-grounded conclusions about material performance and properties.
- Selects and applies suitable analytical approaches to assess the functionality, durability and stability of materials used for energy storage.
- Uses scientific software for spectral analysis, impedance modelling and visualization of measurement results.

Social Skills:

- Plans and conducts measurement activities independently with respect to safety procedures and quality standards.
- Works effectively in group-based laboratory settings, contributing to shared data analysis, discussions, presentations of results and preparation of final reports.
- Demonstrates responsibility in data management, preparation of documentation after experiments and critical evaluation of the accuracy and reliability of performed measurements.

The separation of functions between the education process and validation will be ensured. The Project Manager will verify the learning outcomes of the Participants at the beginning of the education process through a pre-test. At the end of the education process, a comprehensive exam (a post-test) will be conducted to assess the knowledge, skills, and social competencies acquired by the Project Participants. In order to obtain a positive grade, it will be necessary to master the learning outcomes to at least a satisfactory degree (min. 51%).

After completing the Education Program, the Project Participants will complete an Evaluation Questionnaire (Appendix 4) regarding their satisfaction with the Education Program (the Course's substantive and organizational aspects will be assessed).

After completing the Education Program with a positive assessment Participants will receive a certificate, which will also be issued as a micro-credential, provided by WUT according to separate regulations adopted by WUT, the receipt of which they certify in writing (Appendix 5).

§8 Personal Data

1. The Project Participant consents to the processing and inclusion in the Organizer's database of their personal data contained in the Application Form and the Declaration of Participation in the Project, which will be used for purposes related to the organization and implementation of the Project, in accordance with Article 13(1) and (2) of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council.
2. The Organizer informs that:

 - c) the legal basis for the processing of personal data is Article 6(1)(a) GDPR – consent of the data subject, and Article 6(1)(c) GDPR – a legal obligation on the data controller;
 - d) personal data will be stored for the period necessary to achieve the purpose of processing, i.e. for the implementation and settlement of the Project;
 - e) each person who has expressed interest in participating in the Project has the right to request from the controller access to their personal data, rectification, erasure or restriction of processing, as well as the right to object to the processing and the right to data portability;
 - f) each person who has expressed interest in participating in the Project has the right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority, which in Poland is the President of the Personal Data Protection Office, address: Moniuszki 1A Street, 00-014 Warsaw, if they consider that the processing of their personal data violates the provisions of the regulation indicated above;
 - g) providing personal data is a statutory requirement;
 - h) decisions regarding the Project Participant and their personal data will not be made in an automated manner, including profiling;
 - i) Personal data of Project Participants may be entrusted to or disclosed to entities to whom WUT has delegated the performance of tasks under the Project, including third parties providing services that are necessary to achieve the purposes for which we process your personal data (e.g. IT services, electronic communications, hosting services). Project Participants data may also be disclosed to recipients to whom disclosure is required under applicable laws or pursuant to a court decision or a decision of another authority, including public authorities and entities performing public tasks or acting on behalf of public authorities, within the scope and for the purposes arising from legal provisions.
 - j) Project Participants personal data will not be transferred to a third country.

The Project Participant has the right to access, rectify, and erase their personal data from the WUT database.

§9 Consent to the Processing of Image

Pursuant to Article 81(1) of the Act of 4 February 1994 on Copyright and Related Rights (consolidated text of 6 December 2024, Journal of Laws of 2025, item 24, as amended), each Project Participant grants WUT a free of charge, multiple-use, and unlimited in time right to record and disseminate their image captured in

photographs and recordings made during the Project, without the need for prior approval on each occasion. The free of charge consent to record and disseminate the Project Participant's image also includes its use, recording, reproduction, copying, editing, processing, and duplication by any technique or through any medium, solely for promotional and archival purposes.

§10 Final Provisions

1. These Regulations shall enter into force on the date of commencement of recruitment for the Course specified in the announcement referred to in §3(1).
2. The Organizer may amend these Regulations if necessary, due to changes in the Project guidelines, changes in applicable laws, or changes in the conditions for implementation of the Project.
3. Any disputes that may arise in connection with the application of these provisions shall be resolved amicably. If no agreement is reached, the court having exclusive jurisdiction to resolve any disputes shall be the court having jurisdiction over the Organizer.
4. In matters not covered by these Regulations, decisions shall be made by the Project Manager.
5. In matters not covered by these Regulations, the relevant provisions of Polish law shall apply, including, in particular, the Civil Code.
